Following widespread community consultation, the items and suggestions for 1 to 15 have been raised and considered appropriate for consideration by the LTC.

Items 17, 18 and 19 as well as items 11 and 12 have been raised previously with TfNSW and are under development in conjunction with USC.

2. Bundarra Central School	Build a pedestrian safety island at the front of the school for crossing over to the eastern side of our CBD	 Review by MCI and staff Check for need Put out the traffic counters Unsure if any of these have been conducted.

		Current upgrade plan attached, pedestrian islands and fencing to ensure no crossing on bridge approach, but crossing available on Bendemeer St, Bowline to Tomline section. Is a median required on this segment, very wide width and median present.
		Could look at this corner with the TfNSW Transport Planner for concept.

3. Bundarra	Install wheelchair access curbs on all intersections of our footpaths in the CBD, as we have several residents who use mobility scooters (some with disabilities, some with age).	 Recommend PAMP for Bundarra List for funded in 23/24 Check if funding is available by TfNSW Unsure if any of these have been conducted. Response from the IDID – This item can be included for consideration in the Asset Management Plan and be progressively completed as the funding is either secured from grants or assigned by Council.
4. Bridge Street	Signs be erected on warning traffic that this is a reverse parking area and traffic may stop suddenly.	• Not recommended by LTC. <i>Response from the IDID</i> - No further action required.
5. Thunderbolts Way - Alma Park. Site of recent B- double track accident - could impact on designation of Highway for HML traffic	Sufficient signage (could include flashing slow down sign), camber of corner, severity of curve on downhill section of smooth tar after drizzle (worse after frost/snow). Anecdotal evidence of previous 'near misses' as vehicles failed to negotiate turn.	 TfNSW to Investigate with USC staff Unsure if any of these have been conducted. Response from the IDID – Staff have made contact with TfNSW, Transport Planner.
6. Lone Pine Bridge and Souter Street, Bundarra	Establish a clearly marked "child safety area"	 No action proposed <i>Response from the IDID</i> - No further action required.
7. Thunderbolts Way at the multipurpose courts in Bundarra	Most of the users of the multi- purpose courts in Bundarra live on the other side of the road to the courts. Vehicles often speed through Bundarra so there is a need for a pedestrian crossing/safety island to cross.	 USC will investigate and propose project if appropriate Site visit with TfNSW USC to deploy traffic counter – at court location Potential to narrow lane and provide 3 of 2m minimum refuge with kerb extension at proposed refuge locations Could be Active Transport funded project Unsure if any of these have been conducted. 8. 8 Intersection of Barleyfields Road and New England Highway	Traffic turning right onto highway have no merge lane	 Temporary road change TfNSW to investigate – no action. Response from the IDID – No action required from USC. Action is with TfNSW.
9. 9 Pedestrian crossing across Hill Street (between Subway and Alternate Root)	Traffic travelling south down the highway wishing to turn left has limited visibility to see pedestrians crossing the road to the south. A few minor "rear enders" have occurred here, and often, to avoid traffic build up behind them, vehicles will often shoot across the pedestrian crossing just missing pedestrians.	 Current arrangement may not meet Australian Standards TfNSW and USC to review Unsure if any of these have been conducted. Response from the IDID - To be considered with TfNSW Senior Transport Planner. Attain a concept to apply for funding.
10. Gostwyck Street to McCrossin Street	Relocate 50/80 km/h signs further along Gostwyck Road to protect large number of walkers (no footpath) and kids on bikes near BMX track.	 TfNSW to review USC to place traffic counters Unsure if any of these have been conducted. Response from the IDID – Organise and inspection with TfNSW and pursue moving the road speed sign.
11. Bundarra Road/Pinegrove Road Intersection	Improve visibility and signage. Two major accidents in the past two years of which the latest resulted in a fatal casualty. The intersection, when driving along Pinegrove Road from Invergowrie, is obscured by overhanging trees, poor signage and faded road lines, which all contribute to the poor visibility of the significant intersection ahead. Suggest a stop sign there.	 Fatal Response funding may be available? Table D.1 17.42 in Australian Standards Line marking required Double barrier lines to extend from intersection for 180m to 250m Give Way signs – check existing signage Slow Down signage/Reduce speed? 
12. Intersection of King and Maitland Streets	Recently been the site of a fatal accident (the Give Way signs do not work). There have been several other accidents there, and many near misses. Needs careful analysis/design of solution (stop signs? Traffic island? Roundabout? – all suggestions from respondents).	 Fatal Response funding may be available? I have endeavoured to identify new members as appointed by the relevant authorities, but to date, I have not been advised of these replacements – I continue to try.




