elcome to 2023. At the end of last year I caught up with the staff and it was great to reflect on the first year as your Mayor. We have a team of hard working councillors and staff who are genuinely motivated in their service to the community. In the first year in office Council has undertaken a significant reset of its strategic priorities the most important of which remains delivering services in a financially sustainable manner. During the vear Council commissioned an independent review of the budget and adopted a suite of new plans with implementation well under way. We are now receiving a modest income stream from section 7.11 and section 7.12 developer contribution charges. There has been a steady increase in development over the last year; however, there have been a few cases of development applications providing unnecessary additional documentation which create costs the applicant could avoid. I can't stress enough how important it is for developers to take up Council's free pre-development application (DA) service. At a pre-DA meeting clarity will be provided on what documentation is & is not needed for the particular development.

ZNET Partners on Kentucky Dam Catchment Program

ZNET has partnered with Stringybark Ecological and landholders in Uralla's Kentucky Creek Dam catchment to design options for slowing overland water flow that carries silt into the dam.

Over the 80-year life of the dam silt build-up has reduced dam capacity. Council will get a bathymetric survey of Kentucky Creek undertaken as part of the preparation of the Integrated Water Catchment Management Strategy (90% funded by the NSW Government) which will determine how the dam capacity has been reduced by silt.

Keeping the topsoil on the land improves pasture production, so both landholders and the town's water supply will benefit.

Funded by a New England Solar Farm grant, the 12-month project will focus on practical solutions that work under local conditions and integrate with farm operations. Other landholders can join the group and findings shared will be through а workshop open to all. Call Sandra 0428 199 044 for more information.
