Mayor's Message

Severe wet weather has caused potholes and damage to roads across NSW. Wet weather has worsened the damage and makes it hard for our crew to roads. repair the Only temporary repair works can be undertaken in wet weather, potholes which why is can reappear within weeks or even days.

The amount of water on the road means that potholes are often difficult to see. Drivers are advised to drive to the condition of the road and weather.

Council acknowledges the community's frustration and wants to assure the residents that all efforts are being made to provide a safe road network within Council's resources.

More than \$5 million of Council's operating expenditure is spent on transport infrastructure maintenance, and the majority of Council's capital budget is invested in transport infrastructure.

pleased to advise that ľm NSW Government has iust announced a further \$50 million for the 95 regional Councils to assist with the repair of potholes. That said if you are aware of а dangerous washout, please call Council staff on 6778 3600 so that inspections and repairs can be undertaken, and warning signs can be erected.

As the weather warms up snakes are on the move again. A good way to deter snakes is to keep your house and property less attractive to snakes by removing debris, woodpiles or leaf litter, cutting back long grass and shrubbery, and blocking holes around the outside of your house that may look like a safe spot hide. It is to also important keep pests to under control. Rodents are a good food source for snakes, food means fewer SO less snakes.

Sadly koalas are now officially listed as endangered animals and vehicle strikes are a key threat to their decline. Vehicle accidents tend to be clustered at specific locations where a road intersects with habitat that provide corridors for koala movement.



A hotspot has been identified on the New England Highway south of Uralla where the 50km per hour speed zone hour. changes to 100km per Regrettably eight koalas have been hit there in the past two vears. Southern New England Landcare in partnership with Shire Council and the Uralla Uralla Gulf Club have installed variable message signs two warning drivers that they are entering a koala zone. In addition to this the roadside vegetation strip will be slashed and maintained to improve driver visibility.

National Recycling Week

National Recycling Week is held the second week in November to promote the benefits of recycling items that are typically not collected through Council's weekly collection kerbside process. National Recycling Week includes MobileMuster. an initiative from Planet Ark. Council supports Mobile Muster by providing phone recycling drop off points. Council's drop off points are located at the administration building in Salisbury Street Community and the Recycling Centre (CRC) at the Uralla Waste Management Facility.

Council also provides facilities for recycling small batteries at the administration building and larger batteries the CRC. at Government funding allows the CRC to receive a range of recyclable materials be to deposited FREE OF CHARGE including:

- Water-based and oil-based paints
- Used motor and cooking oils
- Lead-acid and hand-held batteries
- Gas cylinders and fire extinguishers
- Household chemicals and pesticides

- Conventional tube and compact fluorescent lamps
- Smoke detectors
- X Rays

Please keep these items out of the household garbage collection and dispose of them responsibly. These services provide the community with simple ways of preventing harmful and toxic waste from entering our natural environment. Trees to be removed at Alma Park

Council has identified three trees that are dead or dying and may pose a risk to the public at Alma Park. These trees include: (1) a dying Monterey Cypress with serious structural damage and several broken limbs; (2) an American Redwood that died due to the prolonged droughts of 2018/2019; and (3) a dying multi-stemmed Arizona Cypress to be removed to pave way for the growth of emerging new trees (see photos).

Council considers the removal of the above trees to be of high priority and replacement planting will be undertaken once removed. Monitoring of the health and condition of the remaining trees within the park is ongoing.
