AUGUST 2010 Council Resolutions

The Resolutions of Council's Ordinary meeting of 30 August 2010 that are not recorded elsewhere in the newsletter, follow. Full copies of the Minutes are available at Council's Administration Centre and on its Website.

At the Meeting:

Ms Linda Maynard outlined the recent Youth Week Initiative and Event Activities staged in Uralla, introducing local Award recipients to the Mayor for presentation of Youth Week Certificates.

Council Resolved:

- To note its detailed submission to the Local Government Boundaries Commission as well as the verbal presentations made to the hearing of 23 and 24 August 2010 by the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Councillors I Strutt, K Dusting, M Dusting and S Powley, the General Manager and the many Community members and to note the local member's letter to the Minister for Local Government, dated 18 August 2010, forwarding a full copy of Council's submission and reaffirming his long held support for Councils to collaborate, share resources but maintain their autonomy.
- To note the report on the attendance of the Mayor and General Manager at the NSW Liberals and Nationals – Local Government Forum held at NSW Parliament House on Thursday 5 August 2010.
- To note the report by the General Manager of his presentation on the first day of the Effective Community Engagement Conference in Sydney on Wednesday, 21 July 2010.
- •To note the report on the attendance of the General Manager and Mrs O'Connor at the NSW Country Business Forum in Bathurst on Friday 20 August 2010, and the opportunity to place before the Premier the issue in respect to the disregarding by Mrs Kibble of the strength of public opinion expressed by the Uralla Community at the meeting held on 20 April 2010
- To note the 50% grant subsidy of \$9,224 offered by the Minister for Water, Hon Philip Costa, for the Uralla Shire Council Integrated Water Cycle Management Evaluation Study and accepted by Council.

Summary of Council Resolutions (Cont.)

- To endorse the nomination of both Cr M Dusting and Cr M Pearce as its appointed Delegates to the Integrated Water Cycle Management Study Project Reference Group.
- •To allocate site C, number 3 Wood Street, the block on the western side of the Uralla Swimming Pool Centre, for use by the Uralla Community Garden Group.
- •To congratulate Mr Sellings and note the Report regarding the Accreditation of Council's Building Surveyor and Legislative Requirements for Council.
- •To support the development of the Alma Park and Uralla Creek HiCUB Project Proposals as they each meet the technical advice given within the Uralla Subcatchment Management Plan and have been approved for progress in line with HiCUB protocols and procedures.
- To agree to the lifting of the 88B covenant restriction of a building envelope for Lot 201 DP 1074880 with it being replaced by a reworded restriction.
- To not give consent to lifting the section 88B restriction on Lot 25 DP 1106460
- To approve the SEPP 1 application under DA 373/2009 for dwelling entitlement on Lot 622 DP 257216 subject to the appropriate conditions.
- To note the cash position at 31 July 2010 consisting of: cash and overnight funds of \$1,352,047.07 term deposits of \$4,500,000 totalling \$5.852,047.07 of readily convertible funds.
- To endorse the affixing of the Uralla Shire Council seal by the Mayor and General Manager to the "Acceptance of Funding Variation" with Ageing, Disability and Home Care (ADHC), Department of Human Services NSW in regard to the auspice of the Narrabri/Wee Waa Aboriginal Elders Day Centre Program.
- To advise Mr S Field that the use of Public Reserve 70690 will not be possible prior to the determination of the Aboriginal Land Claim; and to pursue communications with the relevant parties so as to achieve a positive outcome to this issue.

This project has been assisted by the New South Wales Government through its

The **HiCUB** Project, short for **High Country Urban Biodiversity**, is an Urban Sustainability Project funded by the New South Wales Government through the Environmental Trust.

The project is being managed by Southern New England Landcare on behalf of the Guyra, Armidale Dumaresq, Uralla and Walcha Councils running from May 2009 until February 2012. The focus for HiCUB activities will be

- The urban creek lands in Armidale, Uralla, Walcha and Tingha
- The urban and some peri-urban bushlands of Armidale, Guyra, Uralla and Walcha
- Urandangie Creek and Gara River

HiCUB has been developed with input from an enthusiastic group from thebroader community.

The Objectives are to:

- Improve the ecological health of urban wetlands and bushlands, including Ecologically Endangered Communities by reducing weeds; increasing the area and quality of native vegetation; erosion remediation; and improve linkages at landscape scale.
- Improve the effectiveness of councils and community effort toward environmental rehabilitation through improved integration, collaboration and greater knowledge transfer between councils and stakeholders
- Monitor, evaluate, report and implement improvement in approaches to rehabilitation of urban areas
- Increase long-term participation in urban ecosystem rehabilitation targeting community volunteerism and investment from private and government sources
- Improve resource use efficiency by increasing the utilisation of council mulch; uptake of rebates for rainwater tanks, and alternative energy technology; and decrease the nutrient load in the town water supply.

Biodiversity Month Display

This September, the Uralla Library is hosting a display for Biodiversity Month 2010. This display has useful information about what biodiversity is; the local New England biodiversity; threats to biodiversity; and information about what individuals can do to protect it.



Uralla Sub-Catchment Management Plan Map

A map of the areas recommended for works under the Uralla Sub-Catchment Management Plan will be on display for the community in Uralla from late September. This map shows where work is planned; what work will be carried out in the creek; how it will happen; and how often it needs to be maintained.

Alma Park Community Planting

An area of approximately 3000m² will be planted on Saturday 16th October by volunteers invited from the community. These volunteers will be supported by HICUB staff, council staff and a crew from Field's native nursery. As this activity coincides with the start of water week, a festival atmosphere will be created with displays and a barbecue for participants.

Uralla Call for EOI

HiCUB will run the process for Expression of Interest for earthworks in Uralla and Rocky Creeks according to recommendations in Uralla sub-catchment management plan stage 2.

Frog Dreaming 2010

This award winning conference is about children having the opportunity to connect with each other and the land in a creative, supportive & learning environment. The 2-day conference will be made up of schools students from Uralla, Rocky River, Kentucky, Kingstown, Guyra, Ben Lomond, Black Mountain & Bald Blair. It will include school performances based on local/regional natural resource theme; tribal groups; lantern parade & frog dreaming story as well as activities including planting for a frog pond in the Glen with SNEL, National Parks & Wildlife Services, BRG CMA and local groups.
