Mayor's Message

s I complete my term as Mayor, I would like to express my appreciation to the people of Uralla Shire for the privilege it has been to serve as the Council's first popularly elected Mayor.

With 13 years on Uralla Shire Council and 30 years with the NSW Police Service, I have been fortunate to have served my community for a total of 43 years.

There have been many, many highlights during my time as a councillor and in particular during the last nine years as Mayor.

First and foremost is the successful fighting of mergers and amalgamations proposed by the State Government. At one stage, there were around 1000 residents at the Uralla Bowling Club telling the Government representative 'loud and clear' that the Uralla Shire community did not wish to merge with any other council but to retain its own identity and independence.

Then, following this, the former Armidale Dumaresq Council wanted us to merge with them, so we – Council and community – recommenced the entire process again.

Today, we are still here as an independent, standalone council.

Along with Council, I was involved in the initial talks with Adam Marshall and the then Deputy Premier, Troy Grant, to obtain funding for the Bundarra Sewer project. Following this, we received funding for the Emu Crossing Bridge through Adam Marshall and the then Road Minister, Duncan Gay.

There have been numerous funding grants for road infrastructure as

well as funding for improvements to parks and other infrastructure right across the Shire as well. Big thanks must go to our State and Federal members.

Through an increasing emphasis on communications and community engagement over recent years, Council seeks to provide more information to the community about projects and services, as well as to invite input and ideas from members of the community to feed into planning and decision-making processes.

This has resulted in a strengthening of the connection between community and Council, and I trust that this will continue.

I have totally enjoyed my time as Mayor and Councillor with Uralla Shire Council. I would like to thank and acknowledge the work of Councillors setting the strategic direction of Council and advocating on behalf of the community during the past three terms. On behalf of the Councillors, I also extend my appreciation to the Council's hard-working staff who implement Council's strategic decisions and run the day-to-day operations.

In closing, I wish the future Councillors and Mayor all the very best for their term of Council, and I wish all the people of Uralla Shire a safe and festive Christmas and New Year,

ZNET LET'S TALK ABOUT WATER PROJECT UPDATE

During 2019, Uralla Shire experienced the driest period since rainfall records commenced in the late 1800s, putting pressure on our water supplies - both in terms of security of supply and quality of drinking water.

Working in partnership with Uralla Shire Council and UNSW, ZNET has been communicating with Uralla

URALLA GROUNDWATER PROJECT

One of the options for water security currently being investigated is the drilling of bores to supplement the Kentucky Creek Dam supply in times of low rainfall.

Uralla Shire Council was successful in receiving \$1.5 million dollars of funding from the Department of Planning, Infrastructure and Environment - Water for this project.

Phase 1 included a comprehensive desktop assessment of possible groundwater sources preferentially near the Kentucky Dam site. This has been carried out by hydro geologists Harwood Environmental Consultants (HEC), who have also conducted site visits to check that the locations of the potential bore sites are viable options. Shire residents over the last 12 months seeking the community's thoughts and opinions on options for water security.

ZNET has summarised the outcomes to date, and these were presented to Council at the November workshop, for information and consideration in the development of any future water supply strategies.

This project is scheduled to be completed by June 2022.
