The purpose of this report is to provide a summary of the Library services survey conducted in March/April 2015.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

A review of Library services was conducted in March 2015 with 3 key objectives:

- Ascertain if the current opening hours suited the needs of Uralla residents or if different hours were preferred
- Understand what other services the community may want offered from the Library
- Gain understanding of the access to Central Northern Regional Libraries and online services that are provided through Council's affiliated Library services.

#### **REPORT:**

The complete survey results are contained in Attachment A.

#### Highlights from surveys:

A large number of respondents are interested in the Library hosting the following:

#### 25 May 2015

- Children's activities 12
- Community events 37
- Author talks 44
- School holiday activities 16
- Technology & internet training 41

The Library hours suit the majority of respondents; however it should be noted future Library hours will need to be balanced with financial expenditure and other potential services that can be provided from the Library. USC Library is the only Central Northern Regional Library branch open on both weekend days.

Access levels of online resources are low – further promotion of these services and better links on Council's website are therefore required.

   the library staff are an important part of this accessibility, and can only praise
   them.
- Enlarge internet capabilities, perhaps internet café. Continue internet, kindle training. Bring community into library through exhibitions photo, art etc.

#### SUMMARY:

The purpose of this report is to present to Council a review of the budget for the third quarter of the 2014/15 financial year.

Attached to this report are the revised quarterly budget review statements for the third quarter ending 31 March 2015.

#### OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. That the third quarter budget review summary for the 2014/15 financial year be received and noted; and

#### **COMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATION:**

#### **BACKGROUND:**

It is a statutory requirement that council's Responsible Accounting Officer prepares and submits a budget review statement to Council on a Quarterly basis each financial year (LGGR 2005 cl.203 (1)). Also, in compliance with the Local Government (General) Regulation, Council's Responsible Accounting Officer must include with the budget review report an opinion on the financial position of Council and any recommendations for remedial action if required. As such the third quarterly review for the 2014/15 financial year has been prepared and attached for Council's review.

#### 25 May 2015

#### REPORT:

The attached budget report statements show a revised third quarter result for 2014/15, which has seen the estimated operating result improve from the second quarter and the cash result improve slightly as well; the details are as follows:

- Council's revised Operating Result for 2014/15 (before income from grants and contributions for capital purposes are added in), is a deficit of \$315,442 on a consolidated basis.
- When presented as individual funds the revised result is made up of a deficit of \$483,005 for General Fund, a surplus of \$123,981 for Water Fund, a surplus of \$13,236 for Sewer Fund and a surplus of \$30,346 for McMaugh Gardens.
- On a funded basis (cash budget), the General Fund result is a surplus of \$1,019 as at the third quarter review, being an improvement in Council's working funds of \$57,793.
- Water and Sewer fund changes have been offset by transfers to/from restricted assets with a nil affect to funds on hand, resulting in increases to the restricted assets of \$237,526 and \$85,345 respectively.

As this is the third quarter budget review there have been a number of corrections to the allocations of budget estimates between line items in order to align them with actual expenditure to date. These in and out movements have no effect on the budget results.

The main proposed changes to budget estimates that have an impact on the budget results are outlined in the Income and Expenditure Statement Variations page contained within the attached 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter budget review statements.

#### Issues

Council's operating result on a consolidated basis is a deficit of \$315,442. When this consolidated result is analysed further it becomes apparent that the operating result is attributable to the General Fund, with a deficit result of \$452,659, whilst Water and Sewer Funds are forecast to achieve surpluses of \$123,981 and \$13,236 respectively for 2014/15.

A deficit operating result for General Fund is not sustainable in the mid to long term and will require rectifying with the view to returning to at least a small surplus as soon as is practical, (and a slightly larger surplus if Council is considering growing its asset base).

A strong commitment will be required to addressing the General Fund operating result, because if no action is taken on this front then the consequences may include Council's net asset stock being run down, cash and reserves falling to undesirable levels, current policy settings and service levels won't be able to be sustained and the addition of any new assets won't be possible.

The operating result for the Water and Sewer funds is currently acceptable; however, these results will also need to continue to be managed to ensure that these relatively modest surplus results aren't eroded and pricing isn't set any higher than is absolutely required.

#### 25 May 2015

As was discussed at the second quarterly budget review, Council's current budget is delivering an unprecedented spend on its capital renewal and replacement program; however, this has required funding from outside of Council's 2014/15 operating revenue in order to deliver it.

#### Conclusion

The budgeted operating result for General Fund being an estimated \$452,659 deficit, combined with the results in this regard over previous financial years, indicates a long running structural in-balance between Council's annual expenditure and annual income. This is very common in NSW Councils due primarily to the effects of rate pegging and cost shifting from other levels of government.

Irrespective of this, deficits budgets will be unable to be sustained for any longer than the very near term, which ultimately means that Council will either need to increase its annual operating income to match planned expenditure requirements or cut both annual expenditure and capital expenditure programs to a level which can be funded through current income levels, (or a combination of both), in order to bring Council's operations back into balance and ultimately provide a sustainable position for the longer term.

The projected 2014/15 budget again emphasises the challenge ahead for Council in finding the right mix of asset and service levels and financial sustainability, whilst keeping rates and charges at the most equitable level for the community. With the approach of a new era in local government these issues will continue to be at the forefront of Council discussions.

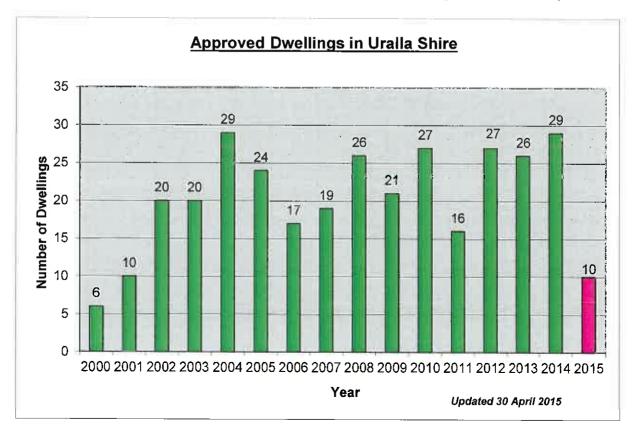

A section 88b Instrument needs to be prepared as per the requirements of the *Conveyancing Act* 1919 to finalise the subdivision certificate and it will require the Council Seal.

#### **OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION:**

That Council endorse the fixing of the Council Seal on the Section 88b Instrument relating to Development Application 16/2015 on land known as 40 Kalinda Road, Invergowrie, being Lot 3 DP 246614.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Council has placed a development approval condition on a subdivision requiring a condition to enforce the conditions issued under the General Terms of Approval by the NSW Rural Fire Service in relation to the asset protection zones.

#### **REPORT:**

As part of a subdivision for J & M Piddington on land known as 40 Kalinda Road, Invergowrie, being Lot 3 DP 246614, a Section 88b land use restriction is required to ensure compliance with a development approval. The development approval enforces the conditions issued under the General Terms of Approval by the NSW Rural Fire Service in relation to the asset protection zones.

These conditions are in accordance with Section 91 of the *Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979* by the NSW Rural Fire Service:

#### 11. Asset Protection Zones

The intent of measures is to provide sufficient space and maintain reduced fuel loads so as to ensure radiant heat levels of buildings are below critical limits and to prevent direct flame contact with a building. To achieve this, the following conditions shall apply:

At the issue of Subdivision Certificate and in perpetuity, the land surrounding the existing dwelling and structures within 10 metres on proposed Lot A, to a distance of 20 metres, shall be maintained as an inner protection area (IPA) as outlined within section 4.1.3 and Appendix 5 of 'Planning for Bush Fire Protection 2006' and the NSW Rural Fire Service's document 'Standards for asset protection zones'.

Council's Seal needs to be fixed to the Section 88b instrument to allow registration with the Land Titles Office. The *Local Government Act 1993* requires a resolution of Council to allow the seal to be affixed.

#### **KEY ISSUES:**

 Application of the Council Seal to the Section 88b Instrument is required to finalise the subdivision.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

The Council Seal is to be applied to the Section 88b Instrument which has been prepared as per the provisions of the *Conveyancing Act 1919*. The seal is required as Council has placed a development approval condition on the subdivision enforcing the conditions issued under the General Terms of Approval by the NSW Rural Fire Service in relation to the asset protection zones.
