OFF-LEASH DOGS & BARKING

In recent months Council Ranger Services have received a large number of complaints regarding barking dogs and dogs not under control off- leash. Council would like to remind residents that there are two designated offleash areas in Uralla Shire, these are the only areas dogs are allowed offleash in public. In any other public place outside your property boundaries your dog must be under control on a leash at all times. Penalties may apply.

The Glen off leash area is available to use at all times. Within The Glen there is a large enclosed paddock adjacent to the New England Highway coming into Uralla from Armidale on the left hand side. You can access it from Barley Fields Road. The Hampden Park off-leash area is available between the hours of 6am – 9am (only) 7 days a week.

Off-leash Area Rules & Guidelines

All dogs are to be accompanied and supervised & able to be controlled without a leash, otherwise put back on a leash. Even when in an off-leash area you must have control of your dog at all times.

Any attacks may result in a Dangerous Dog Declaration being placed on your dog and you may be liable for damages.

Dogs which are declared dangerous dogs by Council are not allowed to use any designated off leash areas.

Your dog must be wearing a collar with identification tags and be lifetime registered, additionally dog owners/controllers MUST remove all dog faeces that may be deposited by the dog under their control. Penalties apply.

DID YOU KNOW?

Uralla Shire Council provides a general refuse and recycle collection service to Walcha. General refuse is deposited at the Walcha landfill and recycled refuse is returned to the Uralla Recycling Facility for sorting and sale. This enables both Council's to provide the service at a reduced cost through the sharing of the resources.

Barking Dogs

Barking dogs are part of life in any town or suburb and are one of the most common sources of neighbourhood disputes. Barking is simply one way dogs communicate and can mean anything from playfulness to danger. Some dogs bark because they are chained to a fixed point and don't have enough room to move around; being deliberately provoked or unintentionally; not getting enough exercise; lonely, sick, hungry, or generally neglected.

Chronic or excessive barking is a sign that something is wrong.

A Peek into the Past

'Bundarra Post and Telegraph Office'

The first post office in the Bundarra area was originally in the private township of Clerkness and was officially opened on 1 January, 1852. Following a petition it was moved in 1866 to the government township of Bundarra, some 275 metres away.

At that time the Telegraph Office was situated in a northern room of the Commercial Hotel, however, in 1882 it was reported that £1,800 had been set aside for the construction of a new two storey brick post and telegraph office at ground level with residence above. The architect selected was James Barnet and in January 1885 the tender of Moore Bros. was accepted for its construction, which we still see today, complete with several renovations and additions.

Previously, the doorway to the residence was on the northern side of the building and there was an open verandah at the front with five timber supports to the gabled roofline. It is believed that the brick parapet structure at the front of the building was added in the 1930s. Frequently Asked Questions

How much will it cost to run the low pressure sewer pump?

The average power use of a pump is 0.75 kWh – 1kW or 1.3 horse power. The total electricity used by the unit is related to how intensely it is used. The electricity cost is in turn related to the tariff for your electricity at the time it is used.

For example, if your current peak electricity tariff is \$0.34 (including all charges and GST), and the pump runs for 12 minutes a day in total it will cost you: \$0.34 * 0.75*0.2 = \$0.051/day, or \$18.61/year.

The cost of running the pump will rise in association with rising electricity costs.

My house is not within the boundaries of the scheme, do I have to pay the sewer charge?

Any house not included in the boundaries of the scheme will not be charged a sewer charge.

What will the sewer charge be?

For the 2017 – 2018 Financial Year the sewer charge for Bundarra is \$552.00.

What is a 'single sewer charge'?

Bundarra residents will pay the same sewer charge as residents in Uralla.

WATER BILLS

If you have received an unexpectedly high water bill for the period December – May 2017 Council recommends that you contact a customer service representative to discuss any questions or inquiries you have.

An undetected leak on your property could be the cause. You can investigate if this is the case by following these steps: Before going to bed, turn off all taps and water appliances in the house (e.g. don't set your dishwasher). Take a note of the water meter number. In the morning, before running any water or using any appliances, reread the water meter. If the number has increased you may have a leak on your property. Council recommends you seek the services of a suitably qualified plumber to investigate further.

WASTE & RECYCLING CHARGES

Residents will notice a small change to some charges at the Uralla & Bundarra landfill sites & Kingstown Waste Transfer Station.

All Council fees & charges are reviewed annually. Revised charges are applied from 1 July each new Financial Year. Costs for sorted or unsorted waste for a car, sedan, utility, small trailer or wagon have not changed. There remains no charge for green waste, metal waste, or to deposit electrical items.
