BUNDARRA SEWERAGE SCHEME

A new sewerage system is planned for Bundarra with construction expected to begin in late 2018.

Council is conducting a public meeting about the scheme which will provide information about the project and provide the opportunity to ask any questions you may have.

Two public meetings will be held in the Bundarra Hall on Tuesday, 9 May. The first meeting will be held at 4 pm, and the second at 6pm. Each meeting will provide the same information. All welcome to attend.

RECYCLING BIN CONTAMINATION

Recycling bin contamination is a growing problem in the Shire. Bin contamination happens when items that can't be recycled, or items that dirty clean recycling, are placed in your recycling bin.

Staff too often find used nappies, animal waste, sanitary items, oils, chemicals or paints, broken glass, food waste and other unsuitable items in recycling.

The system Council uses to sort recycling is a manual system. These items are a health hazard for staff. Typically when contaminants such as oils, chemicals or paints, are thrown into a recycling bin they ruin the quality of all the recycling material in the truck when the bin is collected.

As a result Council is landfilling too large a proportion of 'recycling' materials.

By using your bins correctly you can maximise the amount of recycling you are doing and help to ensure your recycling doesn't end up as landfill. Good recycling also helps with processing efficiency which in turn saves costs.

Top tips

• Your recycling bin is only for clean plastics, paper, cardboard and unbroken glass. Examples: drink cartons (not foil-lined), newspapers; milk bottles (remove lids), margarine tubs, empty shampoo bottles; food tins; jam jars.

• Never place oil, paints, soiled nappies, sanitary items, dead animals, animal waste, green waste, broken glass or food waste in the recycling bin.

• Never place asbestos in any bin.

• Cling film, bubble wrap, plastic cutlery, foillined drink cartons, ceramics, window glass, drinking glasses, pyrex or any broken glass can not be recycled.

Solar News for Landlords and Tenants!

CORENA (a not-for-profit charity that promotes solar offering а limited energy) is number of landlord/tenant pairs the opportunity to install solar PV on rented homes in the Shire. This is a great offer as renters so far have largely missed out on the benefits of solar. CORENA will provide interest-free loans to the property owner to install solar PV. The tenant signs up just like normal with an electricity retailer to get the benefit of lower electricity costs for daytime energy use, and the feed-in rate for excess solar generation. In return, the landlord guarantees that they will not simply put up the rent to the full amount of the savings generated - that is, the benefit must be shared with the tenant.
