Mayor's Message

A

utumn is well and truly upon us and we are so fortunate to be living in the beautiful Uralla Shire.

In April I had the privilege of attending the annual Mayoral Youth Forum for Youth Week with students representing every school in the Shire. It was a great opportunity to meet with youth representatives and hear first-hand their experiences and ideas to make our Shire a better place. Over a working lunch, we discussed a number of topics such as internet connectivity in rural areas, upgrades to the swimming pool, access to health care and job opportunities. We are fortunate to have so many bright, positive young people in our Shire who are our future.

This year's ANZAC Day dawn services and marches were well attended, with participation by veterans, family members, supporters, and community groups. It was an important day of reflection and remembrance to pay respect to those who serve and who have served our community.

At our April Council meeting, Council resolved to apply for a permanent special variation so that the rate cap for the 2022/23 budget will be 2.5%. This is in accordance with the base case in Council's 2021/22 Long Term Financial Plan and not the previously announced Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal 0.7% rate cap. Council

determined this is necessary due to fixed cost increases that are significantly above inflation and without the 2.5% increase next financial year the gap between revenue and expenses would increase exponentially over future years.

Council appointed Councillors McMullen, Bower and Petrov to its new Development Working Group and appointed Councillors Toomey, Crouch and Burrows to the new Capital Works Working Group. These working groups will assist with Council's strategic goals of encouraging development in the Shire and managing capital works in a financially sustainable manner.

Council will apply for funding under the NSW Social Cohesion Grant program to develop Shire signage. A Councillor Steering Group of Councillors Doran, McMullen and Petrov will lead discussions with the community on the design of simple shire boundary/entrance signage and village/township signage. Stage 1 of the project will deliver signs that mark the Shire as a locality and acknowledge the indigenous land. Some of the more ambitious ideas that might arise through the project will be collated for a future stage.

Council made decisions regarding heavy patching on priority areas to improve the safety of the current road network in response to recent damage by weather events.

Council continues to be committed to transparency and resolved to amend its Code of Meeting Practice policy to change the time of Ordinary Meetings from 9:30am to 4:00pm to facilitate community attendance. This document will be on public exhibition to 26 May 2022.

REMINDER: RESIDENTS ASKED TO CLEAR THE WAY FOR METER READERS

Water meter reading is conducted in November and May each year in Bundarra and Uralla, with water bills due to be sent out at the end of the reading month.

Council relies on accurate and timely water meter readings to make sure you are billed correctly. You can help by allowing clear access to your water meter so meter readers can record your water use and repair or replace your water meter when required.

Council staff may not be able to read your meter if it is behind a

COUNCILLOR INDUCTION

A sound councillor induction program was launched at the beginning of the year for both returning and new councillors. This program has been set up to equip our Mayor and Councillors with the information necessary to perform their roles. Training has been facilitated in-house and through Local Government NSW.

Councillors and the Mayor have also attended webinars organised through the Office of Local Government. Council has organised bus tours of the Shire and invited sector experts with general manager and elected member experience to provide information locked gate or if it is unsafe to enter the property.

Other hazards that may prevent meter readers accessing the meter include:

- the presence of a dog
- it is buried in concrete or dirt
- it is surrounded by overgrown grass, garden or vegetation.

Please ensure there is at least one (1) metre clearance either side of your water meter and two (2) metres above it for Council staff to safely access your meter.

If Council cannot safely gain access to your water meter to obtain a reading, we may have to estimate your usage.

An estimate is based on the property's previous usage pattern.

When an actual meter read can be taken following one or more estimates, the account will be adjusted so that customers are invoiced according to actual water used to date.


