URALLA SHIRE COUNCIL MAYORAL ELECTIONS

Cr Michael Pearce was re-elected unopposed as Mayor of Uralla Shire Council for a fourth term at an Extraordinary Council Meeting held on 28th September, with Cr Bob Crouch also being re-elected to serve a fourth term as Deputy Mayor.

General Manager Damien Connor welcomed the re-election of Crs Pearce and Crouch. "With the reforms taking place in local government, Council needs strong and stable leadership, and these two Councillors have a proven record of providing that."

Mayor Pearce said he is proud of Council's achievements over the past 12 months. "The last year has been an extremely successful one.

"Major progress has been made in the development of the organisation and ultimately the improvement in the delivery of services to the community.

"Council delivered the vast majority of the goals outlined in last year's Operational Plan, and is on track to finish a number of other important projects later this year, including the Emu Crossing Bridge approaches, Abington Bridge and a major upgrade of the Uralla Sporting Complex.





"Council's financial position has also improved markedly. The revised end of year result for 2014/15 has seen the estimated operating result improve considerably from the third quarter and the cash result improve as well.

"I am very proud of Uralla Shire, and honoured to represent the residents as Mayor."

PROPOSED WARD BOUNDARIES ALTERATIONS ON DISPLAY

A referendum question concerning the number of wards was put to the Uralla Shire community at the Local Government Election in September 2012. Resultantly the vote was carried to change the number of wards in Uralla Shire Council from three to two.

A review of the Council area has been undertaken utilising the ABS Statistical Area Level 1 (SA1) data, in order to allocate electors to one of two ward areas for Uralla Shire Council and to keep the number of electors in each ward within a 10% variation of each other in accordance with section 211 of the Local Government Act, 1993

Residents are invited to view the report on Proposed Ward Boundaries Alteration and the Proposed Ward Boundary Maps until Wednesday 28th October at the following locations:

URALLA JOINS THE WORLD'S BIGGEST GARAGE SALE

Uralla Shire households, schools and community groups are for the first time set to join hundreds of thousands of people across the country on Saturday 24 October as a part of the Garage Sale Trail. An award-winning community and sustainability event, Garage Sale Trail is powered by over 150 local councils and is expecting over 10,000 garage sales to be held across the country.

Mayor Michael Pearce has welcomed the involvement of the Uralla Shire and the unique opportunity to promote reuse and community building in a fun and creative way. "The council is proud to be actively involved in bringing this national initiative to our residents. Garage Sale Trail helps people to think creatively about how we can reuse items that might otherwise be put out for waste collection and possibly end up in landfill," Cr Pearce said.

"Council will be holding a Garage Sale at McMaugh Gardens in King Street, and the King Size Sale is also registered for 19 King Street. Other garage sales registered for Uralla include 'Got to Go' at 20 Park Street, 'Something for Everyone 'at 130 Bridge Street and 'Come Bye'. at 128 Bridge Street. In Bundarra, the CWA is holding a garage sale in Court Street. Garage Sale Trail is a great way to connect with the broader community whilst raising money for yourself or others. In previous years, the average seller made over \$300 and made 13 new community connections on the day. It's a grass-roots event that has swept across the country, so we're pleased to be a part of something bigger that's making some positive change."

Garage Sale Trail takes place on Saturday 24 October and all households, local organisations, schools, community groups and charities can register via <u>garagesaletrail.com.au.</u> Registration is free and includes a seller webpage that can be personalised by naming the garage sale and listing items that will be for sale on the day. There's also a whole swag of tips and tools available to help sellers promote their sales locally.

Now is the time to pencil Saturday 24 October into your diary and prepare for a fun day of buying and selling. Who knows what treasures you might come across?!

\$25,000 FUNDING BOOST FOR JOINT URALLA & WALCHA PET PROGRAM

Uralla Shire Council and Walcha Council have received a \$25,000 grant from the NSW Government to promote responsible pet ownership in the local community.

Uralla and Walcha Councils have a joint Ranger Services for the local community and will be delivering the 'Animals are our Companions' program in coming months. This initiative will see the Councils' Ranger provide awareness and further education on responsible pet ownership. The focus will be on control of dogs, cats and livestock to prevent dog attacks, and to reduce the number of roaming dogs, livestock and stray cats causing nuisances.

In conjunction with veterinarian services, the program will provide residents with discounted vouchers for de-sexing and microchipping pet dogs and cats.
