May 2010 Council Resolutions

Highlights of Council's Ordinary meeting of 24 May 2010 included a presentation by Ms Killar to Councillors in relation to DA 18/2010. The Meeting resolved that Council:

- Note that Biobanking agreements will be a matter to be included on planning certificates issued under section 149 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 197 as at 4 June 2010, due to the Environmental Planning and Assessment Amendment (Planning Certificates) Regulation 2010.
- Note the Minutes of the meeting of the Uralla Shire Council Finance Committee held on Friday 30 April 2010 and writes to the Home and Community Care Co-ordinator to advise that rent of the office accommodation at the Community Centre would be increased by 5% in the 2011/2012 financial year and increased in line with the CPI annually thereafter.
- Note the cash position at 30 April 2010 consisting of: cash and overnight funds of \$1,466,635.70, term deposits of \$4,505,991.79 totalling \$5,972,627.49 of readily convertible funds together with CDOs of \$327,500 for a total of \$6,300,127.49.
- Note the May 2010 Stocktake and authorises the change to the Stock at Bundarra by a decrease of \$99.27 and to the Uralla stock by an increase of \$71.37.
- Withdraw support for closure of the access way, adjacent to Lot 11 DP 1002332 of Marble Hill Road, in view of objections received.
- Revise and adopt its Draft 2010/2011 Management Plan Volumes 1-4, for the purpose of public comment for the period Monday, 24 May 2010 to Monday, 21 June 2010.
- Adopt the Management Plan Review for the nine months ended 31 March 2010, of the extent which Performance Targets have been achieved during that period for Uralla Shire Council's Management Plan of 2009/2010.
- Adopt the Keeping of Animals (urban areas) Policy with amendments. cont:

- Approve the modified development application for the commercial use of wood stockpiling for the residential zoning of Lot 5 Section 2A DP 113167, known as 31 John Street, Uralla, subject conditions.
- •To note the results of the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water review of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Interim Community Consultation Requirements of 2005 and the existence of the recommendations contained within the Promoting Economic Growth and Competition through the Planning System Review Report April 2010.
- To endorse the fixing of the Council Seal for the Section 88b
 Instrument for DA 12/2010 on the land known as Lot 477 DP 755846.
- •To note the existence of the State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) 2008 The Codes SEPP 12 Month Review Paper April 2010 and the resulting State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) Amendment (Miscellaneous) 2010.
- Note the minutes of the Works Committee Meeting with reference to:
- a) Gap Road Bridge opening.
- b) Salisbury Waters Bridge replacement of the super structure completed in 5 ½ days and under budget.
- c) purchasing 2 x Case JXU85 4wd tractors.
- d) purchasing I only Amman ASC150D roller.
- e) purchasing 1 new compactor unit and 1 new self propelled vibrating roller and defer replacement of Backhoe until 2011/2012.
- f) consideration of sealing Mt Mitchell Road with a number of other existing gravel roads.
- g) a tree clearing request, Council will continue to monitor dangerous trees
- h) Council proceeding to widen the table drain and undertake tree trimming and drain cleaning work of Jacksons Road when plant is in the area.
- Note Uralla Local Traffic Committee Minutes with reference to:
- a) RTA crash data 01/07/2004 to 30/06/2009 with Council and the RTA continuing to work together to identify "Blackspot" locations.
- b) The approval of a new stop sign at the exit onto Salisbury Street beside the McCrossin Mill chaff shed and request to trim a climbing rose.
- c) Council requesting Uralla Central School and St Josephs to remind parents that double parking is dangerous as it restricts other motorist's vision and that it is illegal and Council working with Armidale Highway Patrol to monitor and enforce legal Requirements to enforce the message.
- d) Council erecting concealed driveway signs on Thunderbolts Way provided that there is not a more suitable access location.
- e) Council supporting the relocation of the Queen Street / Park Street School children crossing subject to support from Uralla Central School and RTA funding.
