Z-NET URALLA NEWS

This is an update for people who have solar panels (or are thinking about getting them). Some companies are now offering plans that have a more generous feed-in tariff than the standard 8c/kWh. Recently a Z-NET Member renegotiated their plan to one that offered 20c/kWh, which will have an estimated benefit of an extra \$700 over the coming year (based on 5 kW system and two people in the house). This is a useful amount of money o – well worth the time to research options and make the change. If you want to check out the offers yourself, you can start at energymadeeasy.gov.au or contact the local providers. An increased feed in tariff reduces the payback time on your solar system.

KEY COUNCIL ACTIONS March 2019

- Strategic Planning Workshop. Presented items: Budget progress for FY2019/20; Bundarra Sewer funding; and, proposed New England Solar Farm.
- Extraordinary Meeting to determine Council's position about the New England Solar Farm and to request specific development conditions should the State Government approve the solar farm.
- Budget Review and Finance Committee
 Meeting to receive a report about staff numbers and staff costs since 2013.
- Extraordinary Meeting to determine sewer charges arrangements for the Bundarra Sewerage project.
- Public presentations held in Bundarra to update relevant property owners about the status of the sewerage project.
- The Mayor, as Chairperson of New England Joint Organisation of Councils (NEJO) and as deputy Chairperson of the NSW Country Mayors Association, attended meetings and a question and answer session in Sydney with ministers, shadow ministers and party leaders prior to the State Election.
- Ordinary Council Meeting: Council resolved to: sponsor a medical student to work in Uralla, providing a local medical practice is willing and able to host the student; award community grants to two organisations and three individuals; approve a 10 lot subdivision at Invergowrie; adopt an Internal Reporting Policy; note changes to the staff organisation structure; note a report which identified the details of consultants engaged for the period July 1st to December 31st; acquire land at Bundarra for the future Bundarra Sewerage Treatment Plant; appoint Cr Tom O'Connor to the Community Grants Panel 2018-19.
