NEW ACCESSIBLE TOILETS: WOOLDRIDGE FOSSICKING & RECREATION RESERVE

Two new accessible composting toilets will be installed at Wooldridge Reserve, after Council was awarded a grant for \$116,00 under the Crown Reserves Improvement Fund.

Wooldridge Reserve is one of three free camping spots across the Shire. The reserve sits on a bend in the river, half way between the village of Rocky River and the Uralla township.

The reserve is a popular place for recreation, including bushwalking, birdwatching, sketching and fossicking. Dogs are permitted if on a leash.

Feedback from users of the reserve indicated that improvements to the amenities would be appreciated. Two gas BBQs and picnic tables were also installed last year.

UPGRADES: FULLER PARK & MCMAUGH GARDENS

Accessibility improvements for McMaugh Gardens and a refresh of Fuller Park are getting underway thanks to grant funding from Stronger Country Communities Fund, Round 4.

McMaugh Gardens will soon have new flooring throughout to assist the mobility of residents moving around the facility, as well as a more accessible entryway.

Fuller Park, on the southern entrance to Uralla, will also receive a freshen up, undergoing improvements identified in a

recent workshop of interested community members including the Uralla Town & Environs Committee, Uralla Garden Club, Council and a representative of the Fuller family.

The park is named in honour of Arthur Fuller, who was a keen gardener and valued Council employee.
