During the meeting, Council endorsed the Draft Community Strategic Plan 2022 - 2031 for public exhibition. While the development of the document is coordinated by Council, the Plan belongs to the community, so we're keen to make sure the strategies reflect your activities and aspirations. Submissions close 8 April, with more details inside this newsletter.

Following last year's decision to increase the services of Council's Building Certifier to two days per week, Council has commenced the planned review of the development application process with an aim to improve processing timeframes.

Thank you to the Uralla Shire Business Chamber for hosting an open Developers Forum recently, at which valuable information was shared with Council about application processing delays.

This information will help Council to consider its resourcing and processes so that we can support timely development in our community.

Council is hosting a public forum on 15 March to hear views from the community on opportunities and challenges posed by the recently gazetted New England Regional Energy Zone (NEREZ) and the development of wind and solar farms in Uralla Shire.

The NEREZ is the second renewable energy zone to be declared in NSW, after the Central-West Orana REZ declaration on 5 November 2021. The NEREZ will certainly be a key driver of activity in the Shire over coming years, and Council is committed to working alongside the community and its various stakeholders to be proactive and involved in shaping how these projects can benefit the Shire while reducing possible negative impacts.

Bundarra Sewerage Scheme is nearing completion, with an official opening set for 17 March as the last properties are connected and the finishing touches are added.

The sewer has been a long time coming for Bundarra, and it is a great step forward for the town.

It's tremendous, too, to see the many people out and about enjoying the beautiful nature reserves and parks we have in our Shire, at our famous markets, or out having a bite to eat in one of our fantastic eateries.

OUTDOOR DINING MEASURES EXTENDED

Changes to planning rules will allow pubs and restaurants to use privately owned car parks and open space (like bowling greens) for hospitality until 30 June 2022.

The NSW Government is offering \$5,000 rebates for hospitality businesses to get their outdoor dining ventures in a park or public space off the ground.
