We had the great pleasure of hosting a Microfactories Workshop at the beginning of the month. As a community we have gradually developed the discipline to recycle and re-use waste, and we are getting better at this every year. You need only visit the land fill site to see how we are improving. The focus of the workshop was to consider what we could do with the recyclables and collected the possible transformation of waste production of into the new generation "green materials'. Prof Veena Founding Director Sahajwalla outlined successful environmental and nationally sustainable community projects. A major part of the workshop was a discussion on taking the next steps from collecting recyclables to producing something of higher leaders value. The Uralla Courthouse refurbishment project is progressing well. Councillors recently had a walkthrough of the site and received updates on progress.



The work completed is of an excellent quality and sensitive to the Heritage value of the building. Councillors discussed the range of possible future uses that could be made available to our community from this remarkable facility with the possibility of accessing further grant funding to optimise activities that could occur in this community space.

Our General Manager and Executive Director Infrastructure & Development were recently NSW invited to attend the Parliamentary Hearing into the feasibility of Underground Transmission lines in the Renewable Energy Zone (REZ). The General Manager made a statement on behalf of Council regarding the issues and the Committee considerations should take into account as part of their deliberations.

STEM KITS NOW AVAILABLE TO BORROW FROM THE LIBRARY

This National Science Week the library has launched a collection of STEM Kits for preschoolers, teens and adults to explore the worlds of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics at home.

The kits can be borrowed from the library much the same as books and DVDs - with a variety of electronics kits, pocket microscopes, augmented reality cubes, robots, music synthesizers, remote control paper planes and an array of scientific experiments available.

"Each branch has at least six kits and most of them will have a lot more, and just like a book you can reserve any of the kits held at other branches to be brought to your local library" the library's coordinator of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) and childhood literacy Jonathan Stilts said.

The Library Innovation Studio created the collection of STEM kits for a wide range of ages, abilities and educational outcomes, covering subjects including Coding, Electronics, Physics, Avionics, Music and Augmented Reality. Almost half the proposed items do not require a smart device or computer.

In recognition of this day, NSW celebrates Right to Know (RTK) Week, educating public sector agencies and citizens on the Government Information (Public Access) Act or GIPA Act and raising awareness about citizens' rights to access government held information. RTK Week will take place from 25 September – 1 October 2023 and will celebrate the theme of The importance of the online space for access to information.

Don't flush that!

Residents and business operators in Bundarra and Uralla are requested to not flush strong chemicals into the sewer. Normal domestic chemicals such as detergents and cleaning agents are OK when used directed. as Industrial chemicals such as solvents. fuels. paints, pharmaceuticals and gardening or agricultural chemicals such as pesticides should never he disposed into of the sewer. Council's sewage treatment plants relv on biological processes to break down and treat the sewage. These living organisms cannot handle strong chemicals and these substances could kill off the microscopic 'bugs' that treat the sewage. You can dispose of chemicals free-of-charge at the Community Recycling Centre Waste at the Management Facility Council in Uralla. encourages residents to only flush the 3Ps - pee, poo and (toilet) paper. Wet wipes of any kind should not be flushed as they can blockages in both cause pipes Council household and Makeup pads, sewers. cotton buds, sanitary pads, dish cloths and dental floss should all go in the bin too, never the toilet. Council thanks you for your assistance.

At the June Ordinary Meeting, Council resolved to:

- Await testing of water security options before determining a position on groundwater drilling options;
- Undertake Councillor Leadership training ;
- Approve a full time Corporate Accountant position due to increasing legislative and stringent audit requirements in Aged Care and Disability;
- Award a contract to Superior Pak for one waste collection truck for up to \$500,000

- Retain the existing budget and total remuneration package for recruitment of the General Manager;
