THE HON BARNABY JOYCE MP OPENS THE MUNSIE BRIDGE



Three generations of the Munsie Family, together with community members and Uralla Shire councillors, attended the opening of the upgraded Munsie Bridge on Friday 16 November 2018.



The Hon Barnaby Joyce MP and mayor Michael Pearce, officially opened the bridge, marking the formal completion of an \$800,000 upgrade funded by the Australian Government through the Infrastructure Investment Program.

The works involved the replacement of the bridge's ageing timber deck with a reinforced concrete deck, made from precast concrete panels. The existing reinforced concrete piers were retained.

Replacing the timber bridge deck reduces maintenance costs and the frequency of closures associated with undertaking maintenance.

The old Munsie Bridge was opened on the 5 April 1938 and was named after Councillor T.E.C. Munsie.

KERBSIDE COLLECTION OF HOUSEHOLD WASTE



Council will be unable to collect the contents of your bin/s if the bins are inaccessible or if there is a risk of damage to other property or the potential to make contact with overhead wires.

Bins should not be placed too close together, or too close to cars, fences, trees or large shrubs, letterboxes or located under low hanging overhead wires.

Bins should be placed as close to the road as practical, at least one (1) metre apart and with at least one (1) metre clearance from any other object.

Council's kerbside collection offices will attach a sticker to your bin and place a letter in your letterbox to notify you if there is a problem with the location of your bin.

If you find a sticker on your bin and have any queries, concerning the proper placement of bins for kerbside collection, please contact Council on 6778 6300.

BY-ELECTION IN WARD A UPDATE

The NSW Electoral Commission and Council have requested the Minister for Local Government to extend the 3 month time period within which the by-election should be held. This extension would avoid the Christmas and New Year period. As soon as Council is advised of the Minister's decision the by-election date will be published to our website and to our Facebook page. The date will also be available on the NSW Electoral Commission's website as they will be managing the by-election. It is likely the date will be known by 7th December.

COUNCIL CHRISTMAS OPERATING HOURS.

The Uralla Shire Council's office will close at 5pm, Monday 24 December 2018 and reopen 8.30am Wednesday 2 January 2019.

The Uralla Library will close at 6pm Monday 24 December 2018 and reopen at 10am Tuesday 2 January 2019. The After Hours Returns chute will be available for returning library items during this period.

The Uralla Visitor Information will close Tuesday 25 December only.

LANDFILL OPERATING HOURS. The Bundarra and Uralla landfills will be closed on Tuesday 25 December 2018 and Tuesday 1 January 2019. Normal operational hours will apply outside these times.

\$2 MILLION TO WIDEN & SEAL LAST GRAVEL SECTION OF BINGARA ROAD!

Council applied for and was successful in receiving a grant to widen and seal one of our busy sub-regional roads. Bingara Road will soon be fully upgraded after Northern Tablelands MP, Adam Marshall announced almost \$2 million in State Government funding for Bingara Road.

Mr Marshall said the **\$1.976 million** grant from the *NSW Fixing Country Roads* program would be matched by \$880,000 from Council to widen and bitumen seal the remaining 8.4 kilometre stretch of Bingara Road, between Bundarra and Copeton Dam and Bingara.



MT MUTTON BUSH CARE VOLUNTEERS

The last Mt Mutton bushland regeneration, working bee for 2018 will be on 17 December. This year, 10 volunteers have helped to increase native wildflower abundance on Mt Mutton.

The volunteers have assisted by removing weeds that compete against native wildflowers and grasses for space, light and water.
