COUNCIL RATE INCREASE

Council Rate Increase For 2014 / 2015

The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) set the 2014/2015 rate pegging percentage at 2.3%, well below many of the cost increase for Council. Councils throughout NSW are asking their Communities to approve special rate variations (SRVs) applications to catch up on their infrastructure backlogs and/or to make up the short fall of the IPART rate pegging.

The Uralla Shire Council's ten year long term financial plan 2012/2013 to 2022/2023 had been developed on the basis of a 3.5% increase in rates for the year 2014/2015.

The reduced rate pegged percentage will mean that Council will need to find a net \$42,385 in budget cuts from the forward estimates. A reduction in the forward estimates for the 2014/2015 year is considered more prudent than seeking a SRV from the Community.

The Uralla Shire Council at its December meeting resolved; to continue to live within its means and its forward estimates bottom line; and adopt the IPART rate pegging percentage of 2.3% for its increase in general rates for 2014/2015 and not seek any Special Rate Variation.

Council's rating and annual charges structure involves the general rate, base rate and environmental levy that are applicable to every rateable property within the Shire. In addition, there are annual charges for water, sewer, stormwater, domestic waste collection and recycling charges that are applicable to those properties that are within the areas that receive those services.

The water usage charge has doubled from \$1.00 per kilolitre in 2007/2008 to \$2.00 per kilolitre in 2013/2014 to meet the Best Practice target of raising more than 50% of water income from user charges. Now that this has been achieved; Council will be reducing the water access charge in 2014/2015 from last year's \$283.00 to \$250.00.

The average projected increases, in the 2014/2015 budget deliberations, for the total general rates and annual charges (Waste, Water, Sewer, Stormwater and Environmental Levy where applicable) appearing on your rate notices will be 1.82% for Farmland, 2.93% for Rural Residential, 3.43% for Bundarra Residential and 3.53% for Uralla Residential.
