DO NOT DRINK ALERT REMAINS IN EFFECT FOR URALLA TOWN WATER SUPPLY

Arsenic has been detected in the Uralla drinking water supply above the Australian Drinking Water Guideline value of 0.01 milligrams per litre. The bottled water alert issued on 18 December 2019 will remain in effect until Council is satisfied the town water supply meets the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.

Bottled water should be used for drinking, food preparation, making ice, cleaning teeth, and gargling. Bottled water is available free of charge to residents at Foodworks Uralla and the Invergowrie Store during normal business hours.

Uralla town water is safe to use for hand washing, showering, bathing, and dish washing, and washing clothes. It is also safe to give to pets and stock. Boiling water will not make it safe to drink.

Council is ensuring the elderly and those with additional support needs have an adequate supply of bottled water and is working with local organisations and businesses so that bottled water is provided to those who cannot access the bottled water collection points.

Council encourages all residents to check on their neighbours, especially the elderly and those with additional support needs, to ensure they have access to adequate bottled water supply for drinking and food preparation. BUNDARRA WATER RESTRICTIONS LIFTED

Bundarra's Level 5 water restrictions were lifted on 14th January 2020 due to welcome rains in January. Sufficient rainfall in the Gwydir River catchment has replenished Taylors Pond, the raw water source for Bundarra.

Although no water restrictions are currently in place, residents are asked to remain mindful of their water consumption, as water shortages and drought conditions continue across the region.

URALLA AT LEVEL 5 WATER RESTRICTIONS

Due to continued dry conditions, Uralla commenced Level 5 water restrictions on Monday, 6 January 2020. Implications of Level 5 water restrictions for residents are:

- Watering of lawns and gardens using a hand held hose with buckets, cans or trigger nozzles is prohibited.
- The use of sprinklers and fixed hoses, and watering new turf, is prohibited.
- Vehicle washing is prohibited. Cleaning of vehicle windows is permitted.
- Water carting for domestic, hospital, aged care and school use only – no stock watering.
- Irrigation of sports fields is prohibited.

WATER USAGE CONSERVATION

Despite welcome rainfall in January, water storages remain low and dry conditions continue across the region.

We can all take steps to make our water consumption more efficient in our daily lives at home, at school or in business. Daily water usage targets are **150 litres per person per day**.

- Take a shorter shower and use a shower timer to aim for 3 minutes. Make sure you turn off the tap when you lather up. You can save up to eight litres for each minute you shave off your daily scrub.
- Use a container to collect water when washing fruit and veg in the sink and use this to water your garden.
- Fix leaky taps. A slowly dripping tap can waste thousands of litres of water per year.
- Only run full loads in the dishwasher and the washing machine to maximise efficiency.
- Replace tap washers and seals annually.
- Use mulch in the garden to retain moisture in the soil.
- Install rainwater tanks and collect roof run-off.
- Collect water from your shower and use to run the washing machine or to flush the toilet. Clean 'warm up' water can be used to water your garden as well.
- Start a conversation! Share your own water-wise tips with your family, friends, co-workers and peers to make water conservation a part of our everyday lives and practice.

RESOLVE TO RECYCLE WITH 'RECYCLE MATE'

The NSW Government and the Australian Council of Recycling have launched a comprehensive recycling app to help local communities across NSW improve recycling.

The **Recycle Mate** app is a photo recognition app designed to reduce contamination, helping ensure the valuable contents of kerbside recycling bins can be easily recovered and reused in the economy. This will improve the rates of recycling recovery and assist industry, councils and the community respond to the global changes in the recycling market.

The Recycle Mate app uses AI image detection to identify and classify your rubbish. Simply point your mobile device camera at an object to determine which bin it goes into – no matter where you are in NSW.

The app is currently available for iOS and Android.

DROUGHT ASSISTANCE

The drought has impacted communities across our region, with individuals and businesses feeling the strain. The NSW Government is providing Drought Assistance for farmers and primary producers through loans, subsidies, waivers, and other initiatives.

DROUGHT COMMUNITIES EXTENSION PROGRAMME

At its December 2019 Ordinary Meeting, Council resolved to participate in the Drought Communities Extension Programme to undertake community infrastructure and facility improvements, community events, public land improvement, tourism and economic diversification, infrastructure and amenity upgrading and improvement.

Projects prioritised under the Programme include: McMaugh Gardens Aged Care facility upgrades, sponsorship of the Bundarra Show, Uralla Visitor Information Centre (VIC) refurbishments, sponsorship of the Uralla Show, camp kitchen at the Uralla Queen Street Caravan Park, new cricket pitch surface for the Bundarra Cricket Club, Bundarra park and public spaces upgrades, works at the Uralla BMX Park, refurbishment to the Uralla Memorial Hall, and more.

COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM ROUND 2

Round 2 of Uralla Shire Council's Community Grants 2019-20 Program opened on 1 February 2020. Community groups and organisations are welcome to apply for up to \$3000 for a project, activity or event.

Council encourages groups or organisations to apply for a Community Grant to help build community capacity or provide supplementary funding to assist with social, cultural, recreational, and environmental outcomes.

Applications under Round 2 will close on 29 February 2020. Applications will be assessed and determined at Council's March 2020 Ordinary Meeting.

Individuals can apply for a Community Grant for up to \$300 any time of year, provided that the application is submitted at least four weeks prior to the commencement of the project or activity.

December 2019 Ordinary Meeting

- Received a presentation from Hamish Sewell, founder of Soundtrails and The Story Project.
- Received and presented its Audited Financial Reports and the Auditor's Reports to the public.
- ➤ Determined its favoured contribution to the New England Joint Organisation.
- ➤ That the rotunda in Alma Park be renamed the "Arnold Goode Memorial Rotunda" to recognise the contributions made by Mr Goode to the community as a citizen and historian of Uralla.
- Discussed recommendations from the Drought Management Workshop:
 - o To review the top 10-20 water users in Uralla and work to reduce use.
 - To investigate State and Federal funding for increasing weir storage at Bundarra and other alternative water sources for Uralla.
 - Place water usage information online in an easily accessible location.
 - Include contingency planning triggers in the Drought Management Plan for emergency firefighting.
 - Review alternative supply options.
 - Investigate the use of smart meters.
- ➤ To approve funding from the Water Fund reserves of \$50,000 to fund a study to investigate effluent reuse and determine optimal options for reuse of the Uralla Sewage Treatment Plant effluent.
- ➤ To Drought participate in the Communities Extension Programme to undertake community infrastructure and community facility improvements, community events (focused on drought preparedness and resilience), public land improvement, tourism and economic diversification, infrastructure and amenity upgrading and improvement. Priority projects include McMaugh Gardens facility upgrades, sponsorship of the Bundarra and Uralla Shows, Uralla Visitor Information Centre upgrades, and more. See more details on page 3.
