TABLELANDS COMMUNITY TRANSPORT

What is Community Transport?

Community Transport offers you a way to get to essential services such as shopping, medical or social appointments, by using our Community Bus or Car, Volunteer Driver Service, Taxi Voucher Scheme, or private bus contractors.

Who is Eligible for Community Transport?

A person living independently in the community who is either:

- Transport disadvantaged
- Has a permanent, moderate disability
- Frail aged
- Carers of these people

Volunteers Needed

Have you been thinking about ways in which you could give back to your local community? Do you consider yourself a good driver? Becoming a volunteer driver could be just the thing! Tablelands Community Transport are seeking volunteer drivers in the areas of Armidale, Uralla, Guyra and Walcha to transport passengers within their local community to various venues such as - doctor's appointments and supermarkets. Volunteer drivers are fully reimbursed for using their own car and are required to have full comprehensive vehicle insurance. Training is provided and ongoing training opportunities are offered. Volunteers must satisfy a police check, have a safe driving record and willing to undergo a medical assessment. TOP RECYCLING TIPS

If you have reduced and then reused the waste generated by your household, recycling is the next step. Councils sorting system is run manually and contaminated recycling ends up in landfill. By following these tips you can avoid hazards to staff and ensure that recycling does not end up in landfill.

- Rinse your containers, remove lids from bottles jars etc. and please do not put plastic bags into your recycling bin.
- Never put unsanitary items such as used nappies into your recycling.
- Paints, oils, chemicals and green waste should never go into the recycling bin. These can be taken by the Community Recycling Centre at the Uralla Landfill.

Council staff run checks on the contents of bins and can take action against residents who do not use them appropriately.
