## **Bundarra Sewerage Scheme Construction Tender Awarded**

The Bundarra Sewerage Scheme construction tender has been awarded to Ledonne Construction Pty Ltd, following a decision made at Council's Ordinary Meeting held Tuesday, 27 October 2020.

Following a decision made at Council's Extraordinary Meeting held 29 September 2020, a qualified consultant was engaged to review the tender process. While this added a slight delay to the project, the additional review has given Council the confidence it has obtained best value for the Bundarra community.

Council reviewed the report provided by Local Government Procurement and Charles Kendall Australia and resolved that subject to the finalisation of the Safe and Secure Water Program grant funding deed, the Bundarra Sewerage Scheme construction contract be awarded to Ledonne Construction Pty Ltd.

The Safe and Secure Water funding deed should be finalised in a matter of weeks and it is expected this will be completed by mid-November 2020. The project construction is expected to commence December 2020 and be commissioned in late 2021.

The Bundarra Sewerage Scheme is an \$8.81 million project with a majority of funding provided by the NSW Government's Safe and Secure Water Program.

The project will provide economic, environmental, and public health benefits to the residents of Bundarra in the construction of a sewage treatment plant, sewer reticulation network, and other associated infrastructure.
