ZNET News: Community focus groups to take place in May

Community focus groups on 13-15 May will be run by University of NSW Professor Matthew Kearnes and Professor Stuart Khan as part of ZNET Uralla's Let's Talk About Water initiative.

"Everyone brings a unique perspective on how they were impacted by the shortages and how Uralla Shire could achieve greater water security," Prof. Kearnes said.

"It's important the discussion

includes the opinions of people from a wide spectrum and we want to hear from as many town dwellers and rural landholders as possible, including those in the Kentucky Creek Dam catchment.

"The focus groups are a great opportunity to meet other landholders to discuss concerns and ideas on future planning across the town water supply."

Public Exhibition: Uralla Shire Local Strategic Planning Statement (LSPS)

The LSPS sets a 20-year vision for land use, describes the unique characteristics which contribute to the local identity and shared community values, and is an important guide for future growth and change in the Uralla Shire. The LSPS will be used by Council and other stakeholders to inform policy development, infrastructure planning, and community service delivery.

DA Timeframes

For the 3 years up to 30 June 2019, the average determination time in NSW was 67 days. Uralla Shire Council's average determination time for the same period was 28 days.

For the 3 years prior (to the end of June 2016) the average determination time in NSW was 59 days. Uralla Shire Council's average determination time for the same period was 34 days.

While the state-wide trend has seen an increase in the average determination time from 59 to 67 days, the performance of Uralla Shire Council has seen a reduction in the average determination time from 34 to 28 days.

The median DA processing time for Uralla Shire Council from September 2020 to January 2021 was 8 days.

March Ordinary Meeting of Council

- **Endorsed** the draft • amendment No. 5 of the Uralla Development Control Plan 2011 which will go on public exhibition for 28 days
- Using the draft 2021-22 budget as a guide, undertake preliminary community engagement on service levels and associated expenditure and increased/new revenue • opportunities
- That Council endorses the application for funding \$925,000 for the refurbishment of the Uralla Courthouse under the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund
- Council has endorsed the \$2 million funding opportunity provided bν the Government under the NSW Public Spaces Legacy Program to undertake open spaces upgrades within the Shire, subject to community consultation on each of the proposed projects
- That Council increase the availability of a qualified building certifier to undertake inspections on behalf of Council to at least two days per week
- Approved a change to the date of the June Ordinary Meeting of Council to 29 June
