URALLA POOL SET TO OPEN FOLLOWING UPGRADES

Over the winter Council has been busy conducting a number of upgrades to the Uralla Pool in anticipation of warmer months and the upcoming summer season. These upgrades have been made possible with grant funding sourced under Round 2 of the Stronger Country Communities Programme.

Upgrades completed include:

- Fibreglassing and painting of the main pool's floor and walls;
- New shade sails;
- New water bubbler;
- Removal of the starting blocks;
- Re-grouting of the tiled surfaces;
- New picnic shelters; and
- New shower hardware.



Resurfacing of the pool completed during the month of September 2019.

Further works scheduled include:

- Rendering and painting of the pool buildings;
- Repainting of the change rooms; and
- Commissioning of a large mural on the main building to face Wood Street.

The pool is set to open on Saturday, 19 October 2019 and will be open through the summer to Friday, 27 March 2020. Keep an eye on council's website and facebook page for an announcement of the official opening.

The Uralla Pool will be open during the summer season for seven days a week 12noon to 6pm, and Monday through Friday 6am to 8am.

OFF LEASH EXERCISE AREAS

There are two designated off-leash areas in Uralla Shire, The Glen (all times) and Hampden Park (6am-9am daily). These are the only areas dogs are allowed off leash in public. Any other public place outside your property, your dog must be under control and on a leash at all times - penalties apply if you don't.

Any breach of these requirements could result in infringements being issued to the owner and/or the dog being impounded.

Off Leash Areas Rules and Guidelines

All dogs are to be accompanied and supervised and must be in the control of a capable person at all times. If the dog cannot be controlled, it must be on a leash.

The dog must not harass, attack and chase other people or animals. Any attacks may result in a Dangerous Dog Declaration being placed on your dog and you may be liable for any damages.

Dogs declared dangerous dogs by Council are not allowed to use any designated off leash areas.

Your dog must be wearing a collar with identification tags and be lifetime registered.

Dog owners and controllers must remove all dog faeces that may be deposited by the dog under their control.

KEEPING YOUR CAT SAFE AND HAPPY AT HOME

Owners can provide a safe and happy environment for their cat at home all day, every day. Benefits of keeping cats indoors include:

- Reduce the risk of getting sick or being in an accident
- Reduce the risk of a cat being lost and impounded
- Minimise the risk they will harm other animals
- Give them a longer, happier life.

RSPCA Australia has developed the *Guide to Keeping Your Cat Safe and Happy at Home*. This free resource sets out practical advice on how to provide for a cat's welfare and how to protect native wildlife by keeping cats contained to the home, and can be accessed on council's website at www.uralla.nsw.gov.au/Community/Pets/Cats

LEVEL 3 WATER RESTRICTIONS URALLA AND BUNDARRA

Due to continued dry conditions, the volume of Taylors Pond has dropped past the trigger level for Level 3 water restrictions. Bundarra commenced Level 3 water restrictions on Monday, 23 September 2019.

The volume of Kentucky Dam fell below below the trigger level for Level 3 restrictions, meaning **Uralla is on Level 3 water restrictions** as at 12 May 2019.

The implications of **Level 3 water restrictions** are:

- General watering of lawns and gardens using a hand held hose with a trigger nozzle is permitted for a maximum of one hour between the hours of 3pm and 10am (5pm and 9am daylight savings time.)
- The use of sprinklers and fixed hoses, and watering new turf, is prohibited.
- Vehicle washing is restricted to cleaning windows.
- Cartage of town water for the purposes of watering stock is prohibited.

WATER CONSERVATION

We can all take steps to make our water consumption more efficient to conserve this precious resource. Here are some easy steps to conserve water at home, in the garden and at your school or business:

- Take a shorter shower. You can save up to eight litres for each minute you shave off your daily scrub.
- Turn off the tap when brushing teeth.
- Use a container when washing fruit and veg in the sink.
- Fix leaky taps. A slowly dripping tap can waste thousands of litres of water per year.
- Only run full loads in the dishwasher and the washing machine to maximise efficiency.
- Replace tap washers and seals annually.
- Use mulch in the garden to retain moisture in the soil.
- Install rainwater tanks and collect roof run-off.
- Collect water from your shower and use to water your garden, run the washing machine or flush the toilet.
- Start a conversation! Involve your family, friends, coworkers and peers and make water conservation a part of your everyday life and practice.

Z-NET URALLA NEWS

Z-NET has been busy in our local schools with visits to Uralla Central and St Joseph's over the last 5 months, bringing experiments for students to try.

Students experimented with the best angle and direction to mount solar panels, handy skills when local solar farms start building. Another investigation was how home insulation keeps winter heat in, while a third group of students banged drain pipes into the soil, filled them with water and measured how long it took for the water to disappear. The answer was VERY SLOW on the hard

drought-affected ground but better under the trees where there was lots of wood mulch. This is a reminder to leave some dead wood on the ground when collecting for firewood.
